APPOINTMENTS: Should you wish to come into school to speak to a member of staff, this must be arranged via the main office, who will then get back to you with a suitable appointment time. It is not usually possible to speak to your child's teacher after the morning bell, when they will be focused on the learning and teaching in their class, so urgent messages for that same day should be sent in by note handed by your child to the teacher, or the member of staff on the door. The first point of contact if you have any questions about your child's learning or personal development, should be their class teacher(s). If this does not resolve the situation, you will be referred to the Assistant Headteacher or senior leader in that Key Stage, who has an overview of all children's progress and development. Finally, you may be asked to have a meeting with the Deputy Headteacher or Headteacher [Mrs Callow or Mr Johnson].

CODE:**

1. Adhere to the one way system to avoid any confusion and accidents, parking safely on one of the designated numbers.
2. Get out of the car and deliver your child safely to the main playground. They must not return to the **PARK & WALK** zone.
If collecting, you must walk to the main playground, and not remain in your car or stand in the **PARK & WALK** zone.
3. When leaving the car park please do so in a safe way.
Our speed limit is **5** mph.
4. Please do not enter the **PARK & WALK** zone after 8.50am / 3:35pm to avoid collisions with cars leaving the area.

SCHOOL MEALS: Meals are provided at no cost to families for children in Reception, Y1 & Y2. For KS2 children, the cost of school meals is £1.40 per day. Meals are ordered on a term-by-term basis. SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. DUNSTAN



Dunstan was born near Glastonbury in 909, and died in Canterbury on this day in 988. He studied secular arts and literature before becoming a monk, then abbot, at Glastonbury. He was the principal agent in the restoration of English monasticism after the Viking devastations. In rapid succession, he became bishop of Worcester, bishop of London and Archbishop of Canterbury. A man of many talents, he was renowned as a painter, musician, and worker in metals, besides being a counsellor of kings and a zealous reforming bishop.
