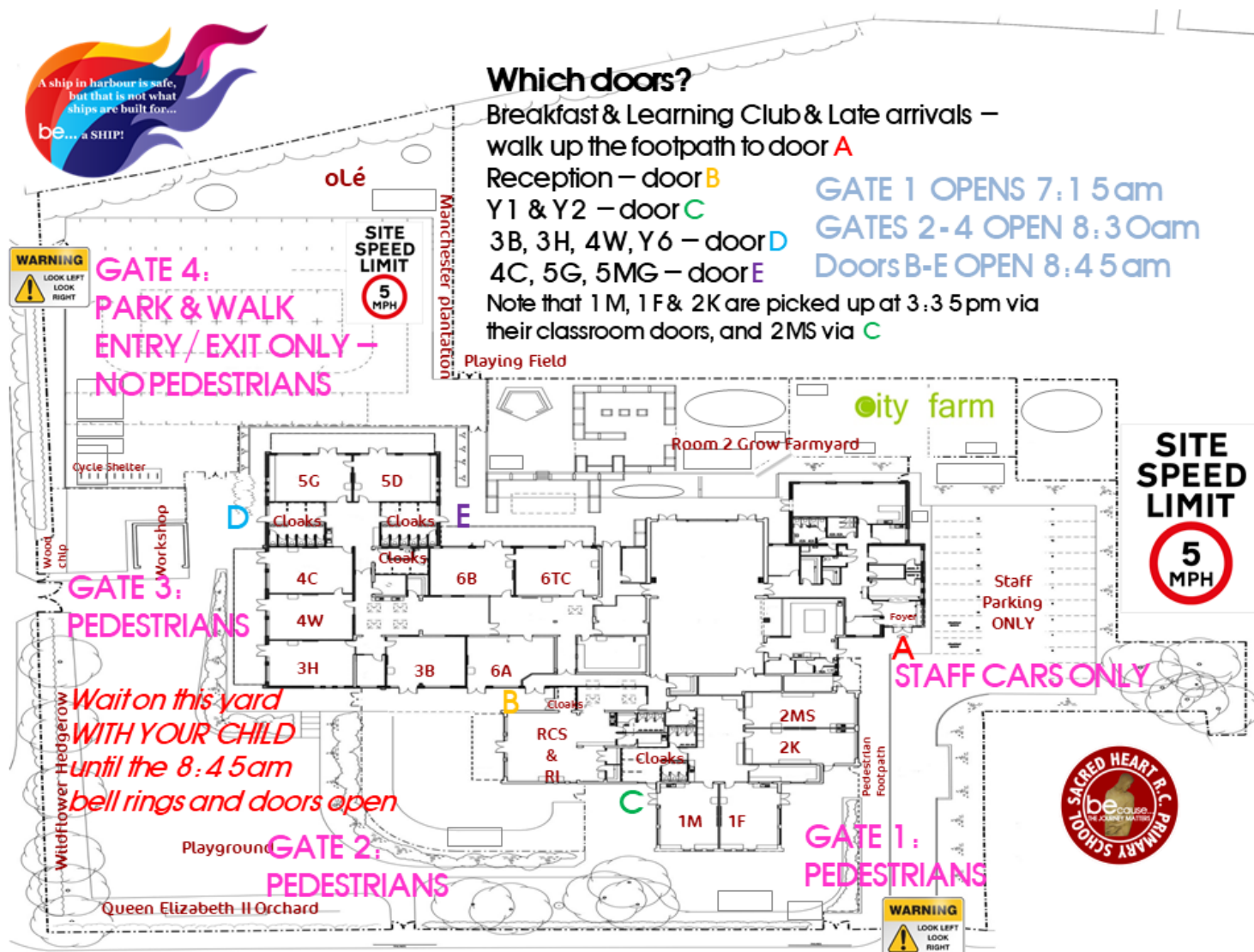

CURRICULUM LETTERS: Letters have been distributed, this week, to every child and by email from each class teacher, outlining the curriculum themes and expectations for the year. These followed on from the opportunity to meet your child's new teacher before summer. Should you have any questions to ask about how to better support your child, as their first educator, please contact your child's teacher, who will be happy to meet you.

APPOINTMENTS: Should you wish to come into school to speak to a member of staff, this must be arranged via the main office, who will then get back to you with a suitable appointment time. It is not usually possible to speak to your child's teacher after the morning bell, when they will be focused on the learning and teaching in their class, so urgent messages for that same day should be sent in by note handed by your child to the teacher, or the member of staff on the door. The first point of contact if you have any questions about your child's learning or personal development, should be their class teacher(s). If this does not resolve the situation, you will be referred to the Assistant Headteacher or senior leader in that Key Stage, who has an overview of all children's progress and development. Finally, you may be asked to have a meeting with our Head of School (Mrs Callow or Mr Holden) or Executive Headteacher (Mr Johnson).

Please remember that this year, Mr Johnson is seconded to work within the Diocesan Department for Education, as System Support / CPDF co-ordinator, and spends a limited time in school. Our Heads of School will help ensure there is a seamless transition, supported by Associate Headteacher, Mr Gallagher, who will work at the school for one day / week.

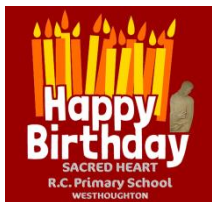
It is important that all children wear uniform that is in accordance with our uniform code. Please clearly mark all uniform with names. Jewellery, including earrings, must not be worn in school.

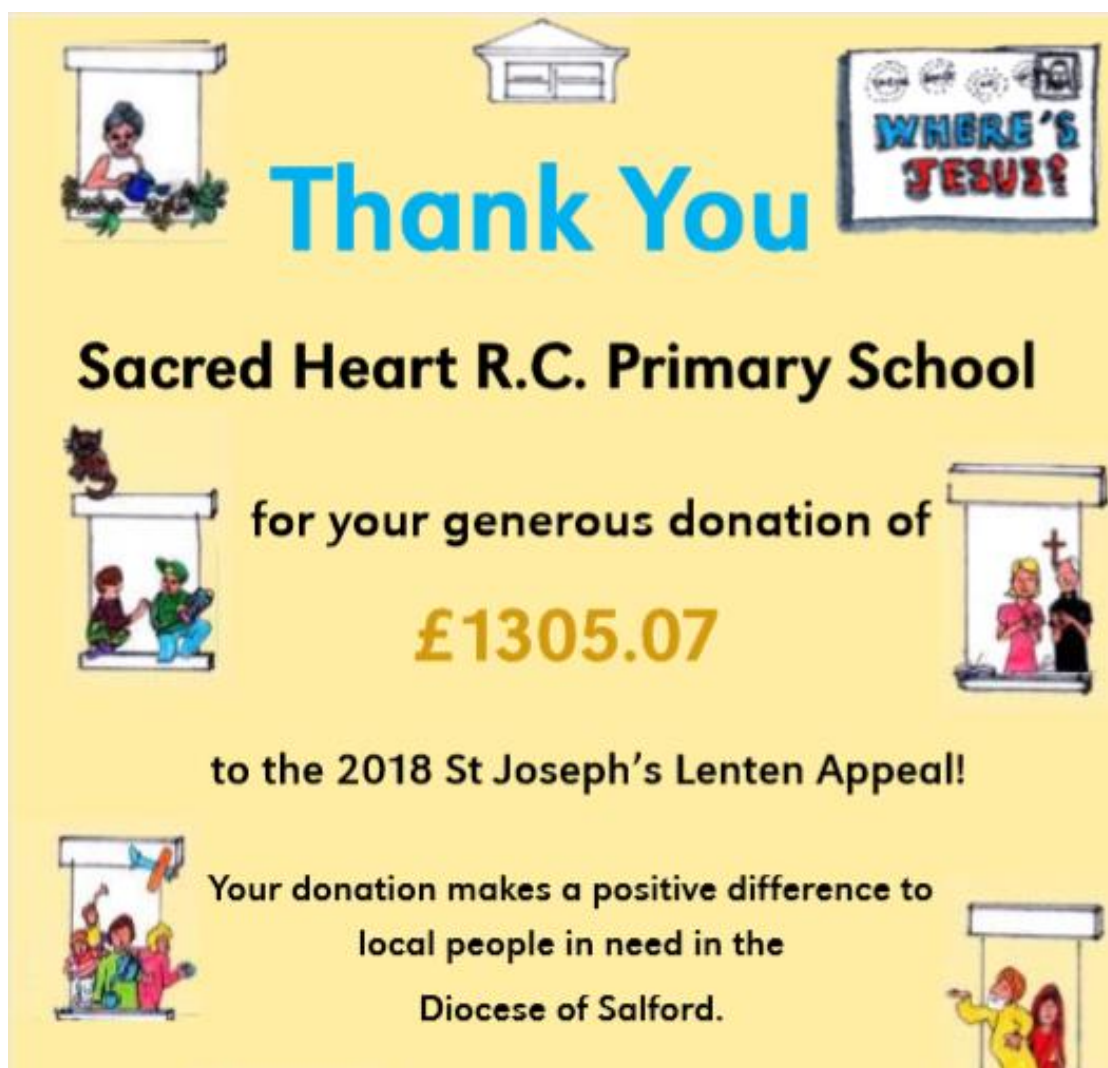

EDUCATIONAL VISITS: We have four strands of educational visit / experience, for which we ask your support this year. **(i)** Visits in the locality – where we walk to / from the place – examples may be to the local nature reserve, park or to church. We often need parent volunteers to accompany us on these occasions. **(ii)** Visits by educational groups to school – These can offer our children the experience of a visit without the expense of travel. Examples include the 'bug-man', or interaction film. A contribution is asked for to support school in providing these events, which may be cancelled if we don't receive enough contributions. **(iii)** Off-site visits – the traditional school trip, for which contributions are asked for, and parents are asked to accompany by arrangement with the office. Some pupils who are part of teams, or who are selected to represent the school may also make off-site visits, accompanied by members of staff. For all of the above, school uniform is worn. **(iv)** Residential experiences – These have a much longer lead-in period so that payments can be made more easily. Examples include our Y5 visit to medieval Ford Castle & Lindisfarne pilgrimage; the Y6 action-adventure experience at Kingswood Dearne Valley, and the UKS2 France experience. Guidance is provided on clothing to be worn, spending money, and other factors. The trips are accompanied by school staff who volunteer to take part. High standards of behaviour and respect are expected on all educational visits.



Our UKS2 residential visit to France departs midnight on Sunday 23rd September, with an exciting programme of experiences. Keep an eye out for updates of what they are experiencing. #Paris18

PARKING: Please respect that over 400 children must enter and exit school safely each day. This partly relies upon everyone parking safely and with due regard for others, including our neighbours. Please do not park across drives or in restricted areas. There is no right of vehicular access to the main school driveway for any parents, except by prior permission. Please follow the code of use for our **PARK&WALK** facility, which has a speed limit of 5mph. There is strictly no pedestrian access through the **PARK&WALK** gates. Gates open at 3:25pm each afternoon. Permits, which must be on display, can be applied for via the main office.

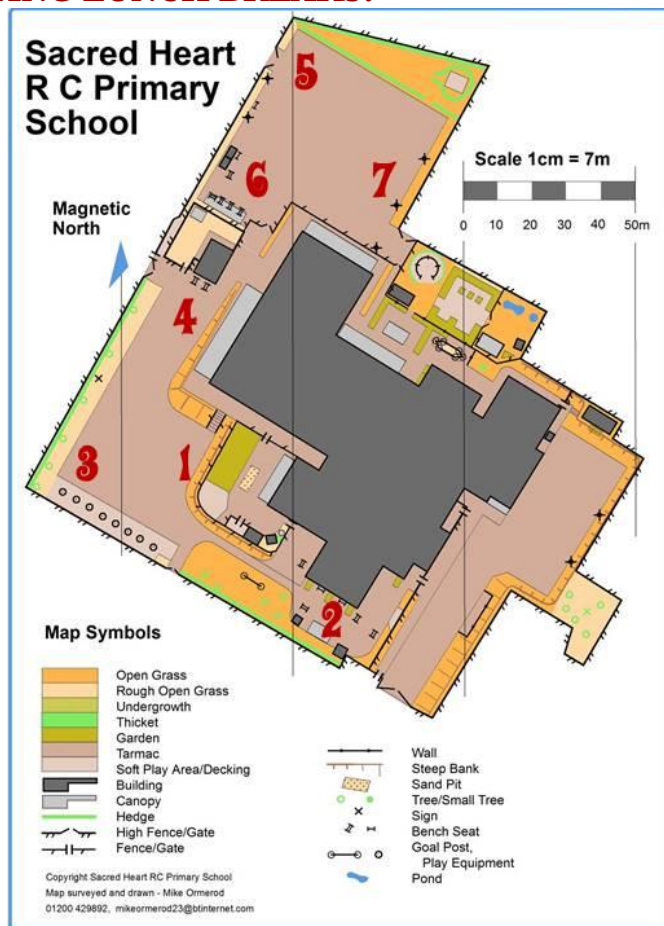

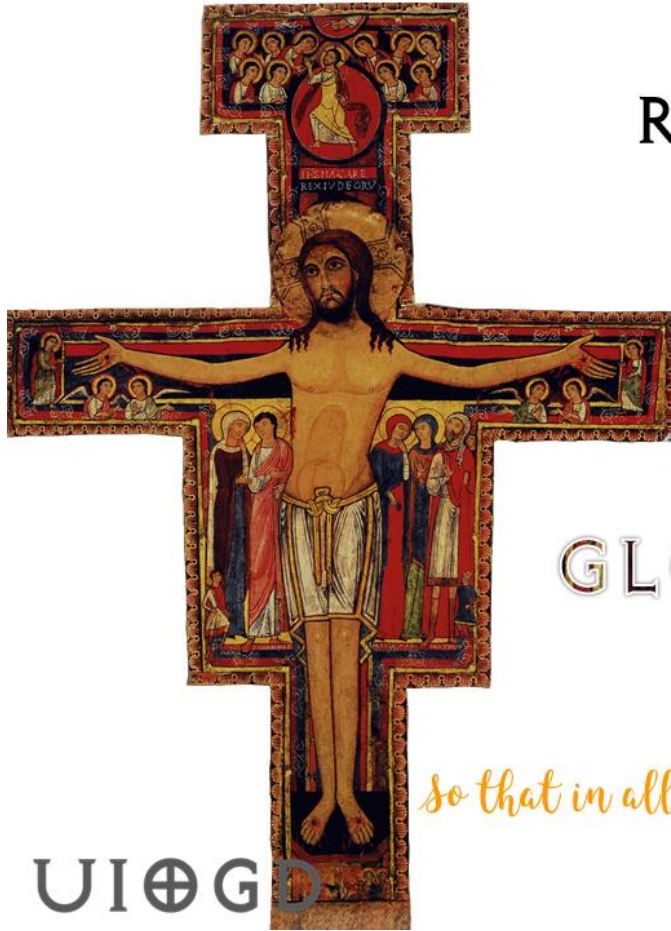

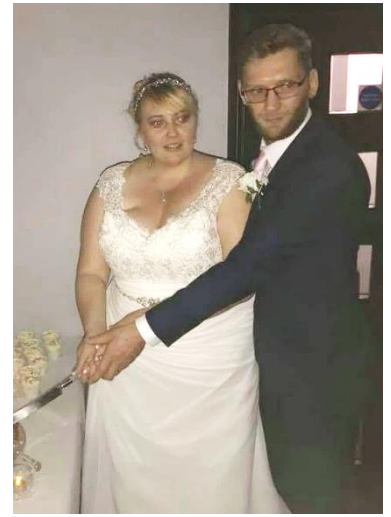
