Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
- Working on School Jam - your child will have an individual login to access this. Tasks linked to learning through Power Maths. - Play on Hit the Button - number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. - Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. This game could support this. - Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the hour and half hour. - Practically find halves, quarters and thirds of everyday items. Take lots of pictures, the more creative the better! <i>Additional tasks may appear on Facebook</i>	- Reading a variety of books at home. Your child could share a book everyday. This can be reading a book aloud everyday or sharing a book with an adult. - Listen to a story read, Storytime. - Watch Newsround and find out what is happening in the world. What did you find out? Is there anything you need help understanding? - Create a bookmark, choosing a character from a story we have read so far. <i>Lila and the Secret of Rain, The Gruffalo, Jack and the FlumFlum Tree etc.</i> - Complete a book review on one of the books you have read - what did you like about it? Would you recommend it to anyone?
Weekly Phonics/Spellings Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
- Daily spellings from Year 2 spelling list. https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/english--1/spelling-at-primary-school/ Find creative ways to remember how to spell the words. E.g. doodles, pictures, acronyms. Phonics play Top Marks Spelling - Spell the days of the week: Keep a diary of things you do in the week. Spelling City	- Write a sad story that Lila might have told the sky to make it rain. What could the story be? Could be one of the examples she gave? <i>Try to include: wow words and a range of punctuation.</i> <i>Ensure your handwriting is neat and tidy with appropriate finger spaces.</i> - Take a look at a variety of poems with your child. Ask them to pick their favourite poem and write a poem of your own. https://www.poetry4kids.com/topic/family/

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of Africa and also links to our Science topic of animals including humans.	

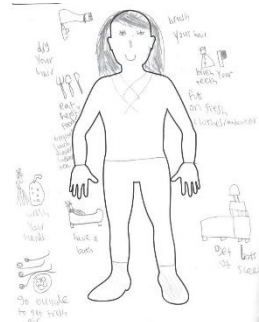


Create an African Drum:

- Research some African patterns like we have been looking at in class. Find an old box or tub (Celebration tubs are good for this) and design and create an African drum.

Describe how we keep our bodies healthy

Draw a self-portrait, research and describe how we keep our bodies healthy. Think about how we ensure our minds are also healthy.



Design a flag to represent Africa:

Look at a range of African flags, looking at colour, shape and layout. Design a flag to represent the continent – it could include symbolic images such as animals.

Create a biography about a famous African person:

Find out information that we would need to include in a biography. Name, age, date and place of birth, school, work, hobbies/interests etc. Create a short biography with sub-headings to help organise writing.

News Reporter:

Their challenge is to report on the activities they have been taking part in whether that be any work provided or anything else they would like to report on. Record as if you are a newsreader, the more professional the better!
