Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
- Working on School Jam - your child will have an individual login to access this. This learning will be linked to Power Maths learning scheme. - Continue to engage with TT Rockstars - Practise counting in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s. This game could support this. - Make a game with your family involving adding or subtracting numbers up to 20 - Practise writing numbers in words and spelling them correctly. - Play some board games that involve counting spaces, adding money or sorting shapes. - Select a number between 2 and 20. Make a poster showing how many different ways to make this number using addition, subtraction, multiplication etc. <i>Facebook tasks may also be available</i>	- Listen to, or read, The Day the Crayons Quit. - Draw a picture or make something to capture the essence of the story. - Draw a story map of the whole story using key vocabulary and conjunctions. - Look through your book for exciting vocabulary and make a list of meanings. - Listen to Newsround and discuss what has been happening in the world this week. What new things have you found out?

- Go on a grapheme hunt through your reading book and make a list of words you find. What promises are you going to make? Are you going to change? - Find synonyms for different colours (e.g. Red = Crimson, maroon, rose, cherry). Make a colour thesaurus that you can refer to in your own writing - Research 3 different types of poem and write out your favourites. - Write an acrostic poem for HOME LEARNING. <i>Facebook tasks may also be available</i>

Learning Project - to be done throughout the week:

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the environment across the world, linking to where we would fly our class flag.

Create a chart to record the weather.

Watch the weather report on T.V. How do they describe the weather? What do you notice about the map? Can you find Manchester on the map? Have they got symbols when they are talking about the weather?

Can you create your own weather report for where you want your class flag to fly? You might want to record this.

Create a class flag Think about flags you have researched and symbols that may represent our class. Can you create a flag to show this? Do you have any material you could make this on?

Beat the clock- Can you sort items into the correct recycling and waste bins? [Play](#)

Write and draw! Ask your child to choose one thing they could do to help the environment in school. Get them to make a poster to encourage people to do it! Think about the classroom and also the school.

The Day the Crayons Quit - Yellow and orange crayons have an argument about the colour of the sun. What colour is the sun?

Lent: Design a Cross that depicts the events of Good Friday and then describe what the Cross means to Christians in their daily lives.
