THE GREAT COMMISSION

The Sacred Heart Standard

Yesterday, we reflected on the Gospel from the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, where Jesus gives His disciples one final mission before returning to the Father. After the Resurrection, the disciples travelled to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw Him, they worshipped Him, though some still doubted. Jesus then spoke words that continue to guide the Church today: **“All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.”** This is known as the Great Commission. Jesus sends His followers out into the world to share His message of love, hope, forgiveness, and salvation. He tells them to baptise and teach others to live according to God’s ways. Most importantly, He promises: **“I am with you always, to the end of the age.”** Even though Jesus ascends into heaven, He does not leave His people behind. His presence remains with us through prayer, through the Church, through Scripture, and through the way we love and serve one another. The disciples began as ordinary people who were uncertain and afraid, yet through faith and trust in Jesus they became courageous witnesses who changed the world. Our think question is: **How can you share Jesus’ love with others this week?**



The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshipped him, even though some of them doubted. Jesus drew near and said to them, “I have been given all authority in heaven and on earth. Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples: baptise them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you always, to the end of the age.” (*Matthew 28:16-20.*)

In the Gospel, Jesus sends His disciples out with courage and purpose. He reminds them that they are not alone, because He will remain with them always. The disciples are called to share the Good

News with everyone they meet, helping others to know God’s love and live as followers of Christ. This Gospel reminds us that every Christian has a mission. We are all called to show kindness, forgiveness, compassion, and faith in our daily lives. Sometimes we may feel unsure or not confident enough, just as some of the disciples doubted, but Jesus reassures us that He walks beside us always.

At Sacred Heart, we are encouraged to be witnesses of Christ through the way we speak, learn, pray, and care for others. By living out our faith each day, we help build God’s Kingdom here on earth.

Actions for us as families:

- Talk together about ways your family can show God’s love to others through kindness and service.
- Pray together for courage to live out your faith in everyday life.
- Support someone this week who may need encouragement, friendship, or hope.

Actions for children:

- Show kindness to someone who may feel lonely or left out.
- Say a prayer each day remembering that Jesus is always with you.
- Try to be a good example by using caring words and helping others.

Like the disciples on the mountain, we are all invited to trust Jesus and share His message with the world. Even when we feel uncertain, Jesus promises to stay with us always.

Lord Jesus, help us to follow your command to love and serve others. Give us courage to share your peace and kindness wherever we go. Remind us always that you are with us every day of our lives. Amen.

This Sunday is the 7th Sunday of Easter, where we hear Jesus pray for His disciples in John 17:1-11. In this Gospel, Jesus speaks to the Father with love and trust, praying especially for those who follow Him. He asks that they may remain close to God and be protected in faith and unity. Fr Christopher will wear a white coloured chasuble to symbolise the joy and glory of the Risen Christ during the Easter season. This is why our newsletter heading is in gold.

Next Sunday, the Church celebrates Pentecost Sunday, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and filled them with courage and joy. The Gospel, John 20:19-23, tells how Jesus breathed the Holy Spirit upon His disciples and sent them out in peace. Fr Christopher will wear a red coloured chasuble to symbolise the fire of the Holy Spirit.



MAY CROWNING OF OUR LADY: Thank you to all who sent in flowers or plants into school for the crowning of Our Lady on Tuesday 5th May. Our children thoroughly enjoyed distributing them to the local community. We had many messages of thanks from people we had never encountered before.

MAY - THE GENTLE HEART OF JESUS: During the month of May, our school prayer focus is "The Gentle Heart of Jesus." In this special month dedicated to Our Lady, we reflect on the words of Jesus: "I am gentle and humble of heart." (Matthew 11:29). Through prayer and acts of kindness, we encourage the children to think about how they can show gentleness in their words, actions and relationships with others. Inspired by the loving example of Jesus and Mary, we hope our children will continue to grow as caring, compassionate and thoughtful members of our school community.

Our new Cubist-style Sacred Heart station, created especially for May, reminds us that the love of Jesus shines brightly through even the smallest acts of kindness and peace. We invite families to join us in praying together during this month, asking God to help us become more patient, loving and humble in our daily lives.

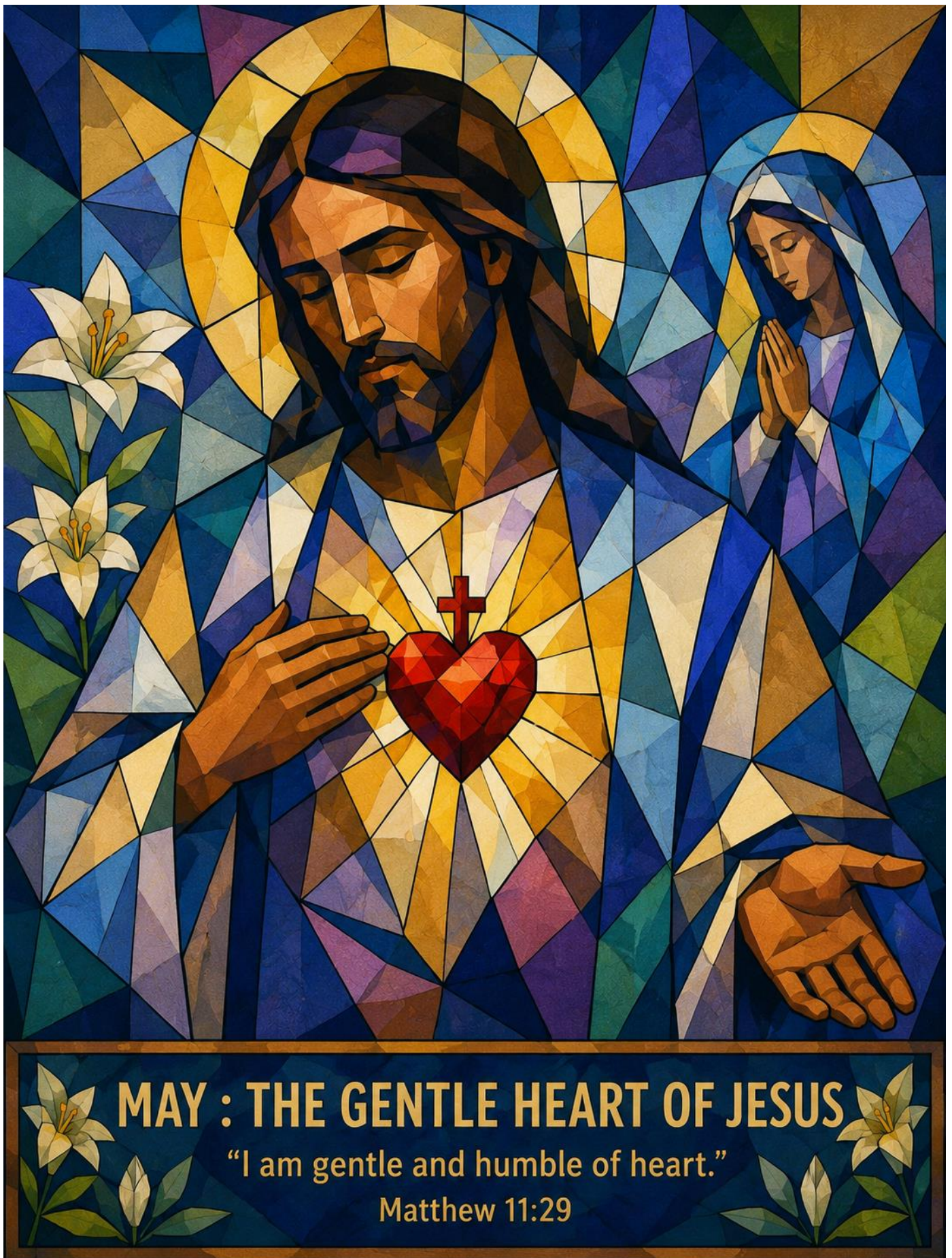

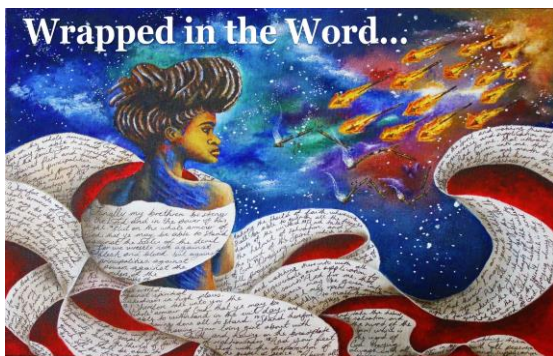

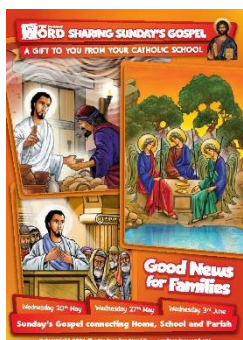

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10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators

HELPING NEURODIVERGENT CHILDREN NAVIGATE THE ONLINE WORLD

Neurodivergent people tend to be early adopters of technology, and many influential innovators in this space are neurodivergent themselves. It's therefore likely that a neurodivergent child or young person may be drawn to the online world from an early age. This isn't a concern in itself, but understanding both the benefits and potential risks is essential. Here are ten key considerations to support safe and positive online experiences for neurodivergent children.

1 TREAT ONLINE LIKE THE REAL WORLD

You wouldn't allow a child to cross a road without guidance – you'd hold their hand, use a pedestrian crossing, and model safe behaviour. In the same way, a neurodivergent child's first experiences online should be supported by an adult who can guide and explain safe and responsible digital behaviour to them from the outset.

2 MODEL RESPONSIBLE USE

Children learn from what they see. Show all children, regardless of neurotype, what responsible internet use looks like. Reflect on your own use of social media and AI. Consider how often you use them and your own understanding of these platforms. Talk openly about when and why you use these tools, helping all children develop a balanced and informed approach.

3 KNOW YOUR LIMITS

Current government guidance suggests no solo screen use below the age of two, with a maximum of one hour per day for two- to five-year-olds. Screen time can support communication and connection when shared with an adult. However, passive watching can affect neurodivergent children's attention and language skills. Focus on the type of content they watch, encouraging slower-paced and meaningful material rather than fast-paced, overstimulating content.

4 CONSIDER AGES AND STAGES

For older children and teenagers, agreed limits are important. Screen time can be beneficial, but it should form part of a balanced lifestyle. Neurodivergent children may find online communication easier than real-world conversation, supporting their social interaction. However, it shouldn't be their only option. Encourage a range of activities, including creative play, physical exercise, and opportunities for real-world connections.

5 KEEP CONVERSATIONS OPEN

Discussions about online safety should begin early and continue as children grow. However, neurodivergent children may worry about getting things wrong or being misunderstood, meaning these kinds of conversations should feel open and fair, rather than like a lecture. If a child encounters a problem – such as a scam or inappropriate content – they need to feel able to speak to a trusted adult without fear of judgement or embarrassment.

6 BUILD YOUR KNOWLEDGE

You aren't expected to be an expert, but it's important to stay informed about the platforms, games, or apps neurodivergent children use in order to provide practical support. Social media platforms have age limits, and many apps and games offer parental settings that can control access. Schools and families should work together to understand these tools, helping neurodivergent children use them safely while keeping up to date with new features and changes.

7 SET CLEAR BOUNDARIES

Children and young people often know more about current technology than adults, meaning it's important to recognise that controls may be bypassed. Clear, predictable boundaries should be used, based on trust and consistency. Involving children in discussions that affect them helps them feel heard. This is particularly important for neurodivergent children, who may respond strongly to perceived unfairness.

8 UNDERSTAND AI CONTENT

The internet now includes large amounts of AI-generated content, including images, videos, and stories. These can be difficult to identify. Children should be encouraged to question what they see and check the information using trusted sources. Neurodivergent children may interpret content literally, meaning adult guidance is important in helping them recognise what's real and reliable – and what isn't.

9 EXPLAIN AI LIMITATIONS

AI isn't the same as a search engine. It generates responses based on prompts and patterns, and its accuracy depends on how it's used. Sometimes, it produces incorrect or unrealistic information, known as 'hallucinations'. Both adults and children need to understand this and learn how to check information carefully using reliable and trusted sources.

10 CLARIFY AI RELATIONSHIPS

AI can feel conversational and personal, but it's not capable of real relationships. It learns from patterns in user input rather than human understanding. Some neurodivergent children may experience a sense of connection with AI chatbots, particularly if they find social situations challenging. It's therefore important to explain that these are simulated conversations and aren't a substitute for real, human relationships.

Both new governors have attended their first full governing board meeting this half term.



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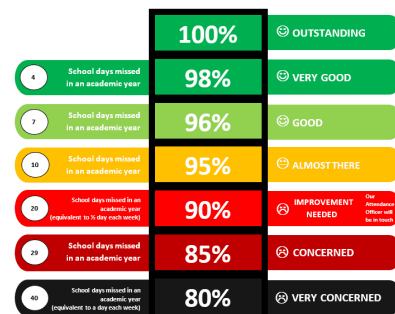

Why did Jesus breathe on the disciples? This coming Sunday the Church celebrates Pentecost. This is the feast of the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church - a gift which we now receive at Baptism, Confirmation and at Mass. Ask your child what they know about Pentecost. 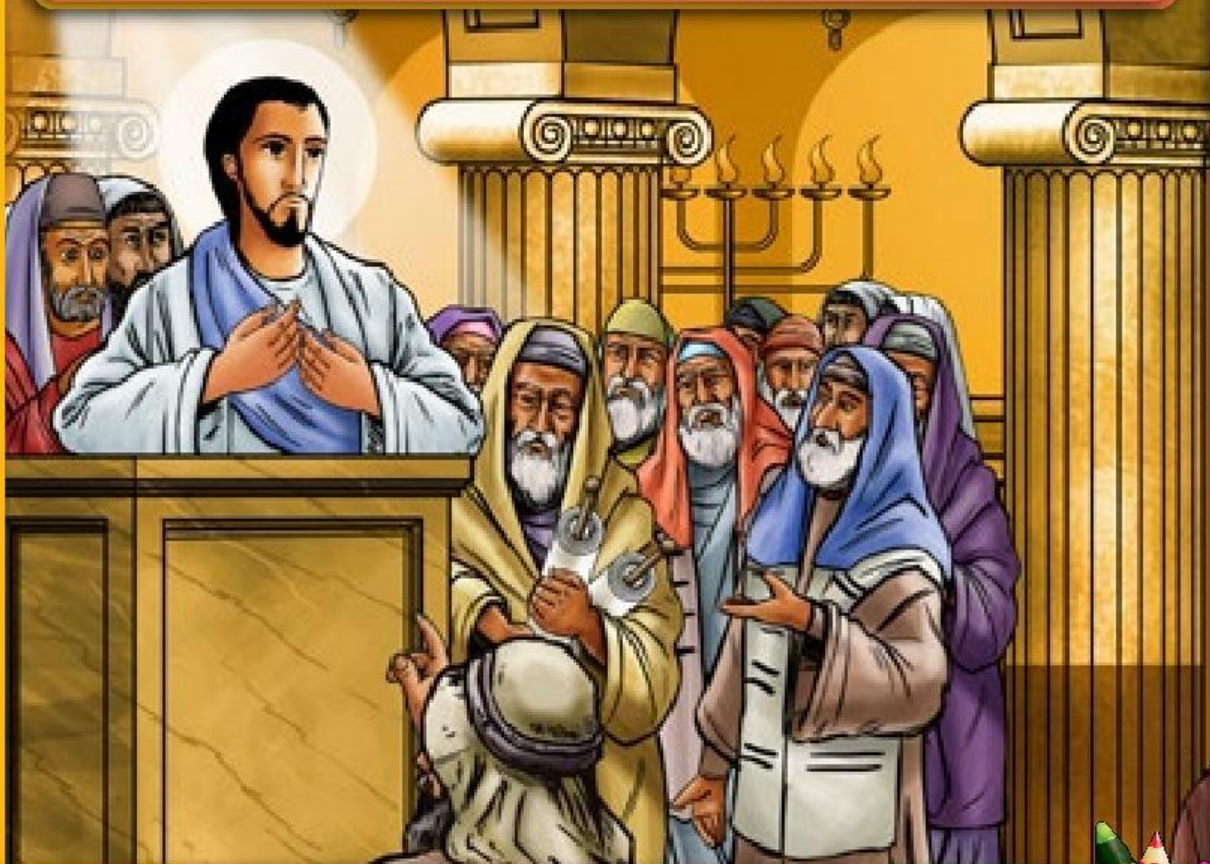
